

NURSING EDUCATION, DNP

Overview

The Nursing Education, Doctor of Nursing Practice (D.N.P) is designed to prepare professional nurses to enter educational roles and work within both colleges and universities as well as hospital systems. Graduates of the program may be eligible to sit for the nurse educator certification examination.

Learning Outcomes

1. Identify direct and indirect clinical problems in complex health settings and work with interprofessional teams to address them.
2. Differentiate theoretical knowledge as it applies to direct or indirect clinical care.
3. Translate evidence to address nursing and health care workforce issues.
4. Integrate databases and information literacy in designing interventions for system level health care practice.
5. Execute evidence-based interventions to improve health care outcomes.
